PROVINCE OF ALBERTA PROPOSES CHANGES TO OIL AND GAS ASSESSMENT MODEL

The County of Two Hills has recently been informed of changes proposed by the Province of Alberta which will reduce revenue municipalities collect from assessments of oil and gas facilities, wells, pipelines, and equipment.

The proposed assessment model is intended to strengthen the oil and gas industry during these difficult times. In turn, benefiting large oil and gas companies, with no obligation to reinvest in Alberta, having the smaller companies receive minimal or no benefit.

The changes to the assessment model, for oil and gas regulated properties is without serious consideration to the impact of rural municipalities and tax-bearing Albertans. These proposed changes will directly affect residents in the County of Two Hills.

Council and Administration are extremely concerned regarding the impact of this decision and the implications the County of Two Hills will have to administer by property tax increases, reduction of services or both to compensate for the loss of revenue.

Four possible assessment model scenarios have been presented to rural municipalities, having the scenarios designed by a committee consisting of Government Advisors and Industry Representatives. Based on the information provided by the Province, impacts for the County of Two Hills indicate a loss of approximately 8% to 12% of tax revenue which equates to 1.4 to 2 million dollars in the first year, and increasing yearly.

Should the proposed assessment model be approved, the County of Two Hills must adjust operations, levels of service and property taxes by:

- Increasing the residential mill rate between 78.3% to 110.1%; or,
- Increasing the non-residential mill rate between 40.6% and 68.3%; or,
- Work force cuts to cover losses between 30.5% and 42.8% (16 to 22 employees), losing corresponding level of services and municipal operations; or,
- Total expense reduction (including capital infrastructure investment) between 8.43% and 11.84%.

IMPACT TO COUNTY RATEPAYERS



Financially, the largest impact will be through increased property taxes and decreased levels of services provided by the County. Further, the County will have to decrease or eliminate support programs offered to other municipalities (including the Town of Two Hills and Village of Myrnam) or community organizations, such as recreational grants.

AS A COUNTY COUNCIL, the County of Two Hills is lobbying the Province, contacting Premier Jason Kenney, Municipal Affairs Minister Kaycee Madu, Energy Minister Sonya Savage and MLA, Jackie Armstrong-Homeniuk.

For Example: A ratepayer with a 2020 Residential Property Assessment of \$351,590 paid \$1,476.68 for their residential portion of County taxes.

In 2021 that could increase to \$3,099.00, assuming no changes in other revenues or services. This example does not include school or Eagle Hill Foundation requisitions.

CLUBROOT FIELD INSPECTIONS

Pest Inspectors will be scouting for clubroot disease and infection in canola fields until freeze-up, accessing fields via approaches.

Designated as a pest under the *Agricultural Pests Act*, Clubroot is a soil-borne disease which reduces yields of canola and other cruciferous crops. Clubroot is spread primarily through movement of soil and infected plant materials. Producers are encouraged to clean debris and disinfect equipment prior to moving to new fields to reduce the spread of clubroot to new areas.

Inspectors will follow sanitation protocols to prevent the spread of clubroot. Landowners of fields that test positive for clubroot will be notified in writing. Questions or concerns may be directed to the ASB Department at 780-657-3358.
